COMMUNITY:

The School District of Waukesha is fifteen miles west of Milwaukee, Wisconsin in the rolling hills of Waukesha County. With over 12,000 pre-kindergarten through 12th grade students served in our 20 schools, we are the seventh largest school district in the State of Wisconsin.

Our schools include four comprehensive high schools, five middle schools, and 14 elementary schools. In addition to your attendance are or neighborhood schools, we provide other learning opportunities including: charter schools, magnet schools, and specialty schools.
