Kindergarteners learned all about polar bears. They created a 2d painting that focused on line and color. Students also created 3D sculptures out of model magic!



Second Graders were introduced to artist James Rizzi who was famous for his cartoon style cityscapes. Their buildings take on human and animal features expressing different emotions.



Third grade students expanded on their knowledge about Jean Michel Basquiat who was an African American artist they read about in language workshop. They explored the details of his art style and created their own version using oil pastel, markers and water color.



Fifth graders explored the art styles of the Northwest Indians by creating their own versions of Formline art which is the arrangement of U, O, and S shapes. Animals and/or creatures play a big role in Northwest art, often representing a set of character traits like determination, patience, bravery or intelligence. Students chose an animal that best describes them as the frame work for their designs.
