There have been so many wonderful artworks created by students over the last month as they continue to work hard to tap into their creativity.

First graders learned how to use analogous colors to create a watercolor sunset. They also included implied textures and patterns with metallic markers in their trees.



Third grade explored art concepts like form, line, shape and color to make the colorful creations you see below. They learned that pastry chefs and sugar artists often start their ideas on paper before they start baking. Many also explored ways to blend oil pastels to make highlights and shadows in their art.



Fourth graders used oil pastels and watercolor to explore art and math concepts like bilateral symmetry and radial symmetry.



Fifth graders learned about famous Japanese artist Yayoi Kusama, who is well known for her love of polka dots, optical illusions, and the concept of infinity. Their artwork shows repetition in pattern and value in color.
