Fifth Graders had fun learning about Japanese artist Yoyoi Kusama and creating 3d Paper mache sculptures inspired by her work. The polka dot is one of her signature design elements, so we talked about how using one shape but changing the color, size and placement can result in an infinite amount of possibilities.



Fifth Grade students have also been working hard to complete their artwork that makes a connection to their Veterans Day concert coming up. Their assignment was to choose at least two different symbols that represent America or those who have served.



Second graders studied the painting style of Vincent Van Gogh. They used oil pastel and watercolor to create an artwork that combines Van Gogh's sunflower paintings with the movement lines seen in Starry Night.
