Student Driving/Parking Privileges

To park a student-operated vehicle at Waukesha North High School, all students must have administrative approval, pay a parking permit fee, pay all yearly fees, and abide by the following conditions:

All vehicles must be registered with the school office and have official parking permits displayed. Permits are required between the hours of 7:00 a.m. and 3:00 p.m. on any regular school day.

Parking permits are \$100.00 per semester. **All financial obligations must be taken care of before a student is issued a semester parking permit.**

Daily Permits are \$5.00 per day. Daily Permits can be purchased by students in "good standing" in the Principal's Office before 7:10 a.m. or the day before the permit is needed.

Students who arrive early to classes increase their chance of securing a parking spot. A parking permit does not guarantee a spot will be available.

It is the responsibility of every student assigned a parking permit to read parking information and be aware of parking regulations.

Parking Regulations

A. Parking a vehicle on school grounds is a privilege. This privilege may be suspended or revoked at any time and is the prerogative of the school administration. **Refunds of parking fees are not given if the permit is suspended, revoked, lost, or stolen. Replacement of stolen or lost permits is \$100 per semester.**

B. Parking privileges can be suspended or revoked or fines assessed for, but not limited to the following:

*Endangering the safety of others

- Reckless Driving
- Speeding (Campus limit is 10 mph)

*Violating School Attendance Rules

- Truancies
- Unexcused Tardiness
- Contributing to the truancy/tardiness of another student
- Using vehicles during the school day without prior approval of school administration, excluding lunch for Seniors and approved Juniors

*Loitering

- Remaining in parking lots during school hours
- Visiting one's car during the school day, fire drills, assemblies, etc.
- Occupying or allowing other to occupy the vehicle during the school day

*Parking Illegally/Misuse of Permit

- Not parking in designated student space
- Parking in a fire lane, faculty lot, visitor space, sidewalk, grass, maintenance entrance, behind the school, bus lanes, or senior lot (non-seniors)
- Improper display of a permit
- No permit (will be ticketed by the Waukesha Police Department or representative)
- Permitting another student to use your permit without prior office approval/notification
- Parking in more than one space

*Displaying Poor Citizenry in School

- Noncompliance with school rules
- Altercations with students and/or staff
- Acts of poor judgment resulting in disciplinary action
- Non-payment of outstanding school fees
